

Four years after completing the study treatment there has been no relapse in the nine participants (of 12) who were improved. Seven of these were able to return to previous levels of employment. The eighth is working at her previous level of employment with accommodation. The ninth person, whose moderate/severe injury (22 years before), was vastly improved but not yet employable. This person has maintained all cognitive improvements, the return of normal field of vision, and normal body temperature. The physical changes occurred within the first 13 treatments. The data show that people continued to improve at 3-month follow-up testing. The three who did not improve had EEG patterns that are not likely to respond to this treatment.

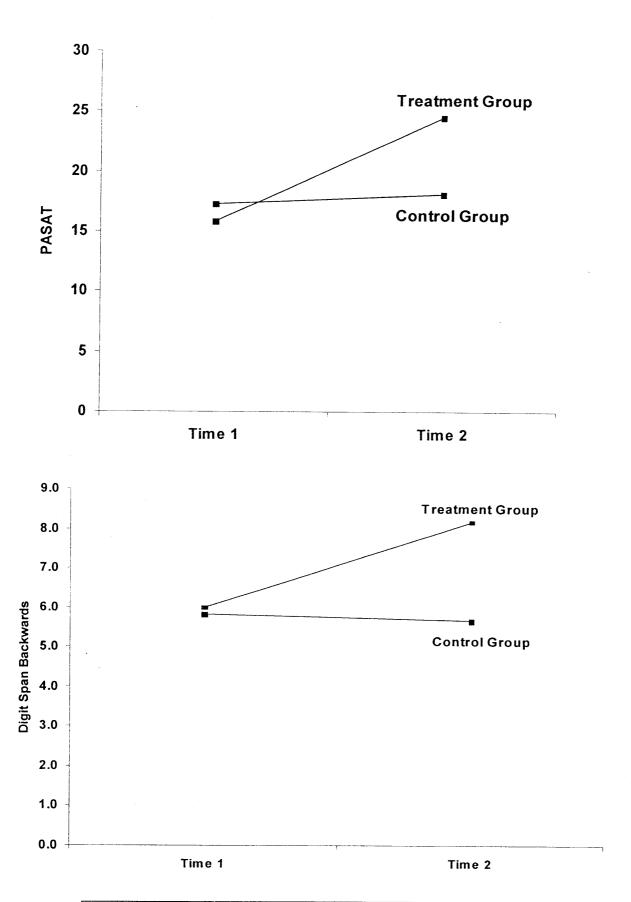

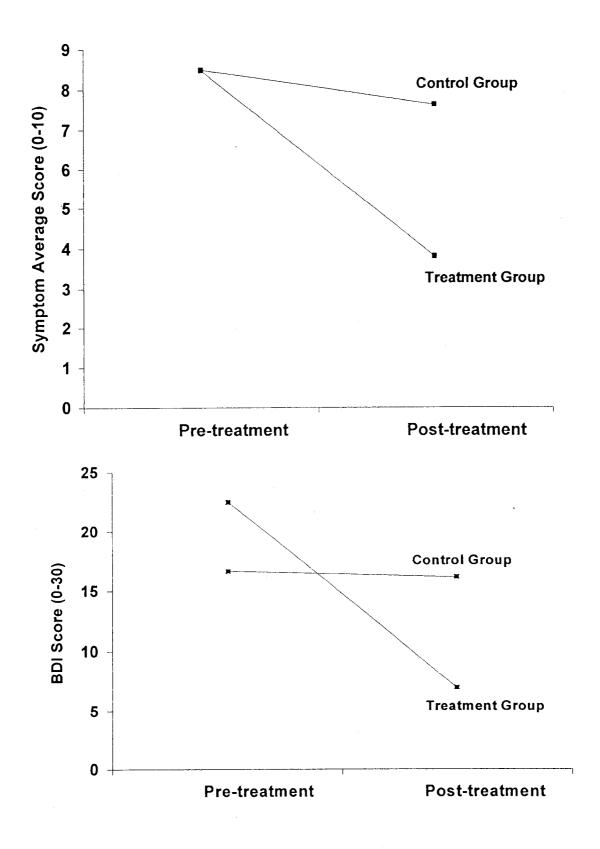


Exhibit A - Between-group comparison for selected self-report measures. Refer to the first two lines of Table 1 on page 267.
